

WHAT IS THE ISSUE?

Animal-related (90% is Kangaroos) car accidents on the rise in Australian winter nights

SIGNIFICANCE OF ISSUE:

42% of fatal accidents in NSW where animals were implicated in the crash were caused by people swerving to avoid the animal.



Data matching to official Government records found underreporting of animalrelated crashes to be an issue of concern.

Of the more than 13,000 animal strikes on NSW roads in 2019, approximately 90 per cent involved kangaroos - a similar proportion to figures from Queensland and Victoria - according to data from NRMA Insurance.

Steven has multiple car accidents because fast-moving animals at night are difficult to prevent He needs better ways to prevent or avoid animals














